Ranger Cheryl: If you just look straight ahead at that whole hillside over there, okay? Maybe if you kind of use your imagination a little, you can kind of think about that as one of those areas Molly was talking about this morning that, as a result, of heat underneath us, kind of rises up like maybe the way you would see dough rising as you're making bread. That's one of those areas of rock that's rising up because there is heat underneath that's causing it to expand. And this is a great place to see that—that whole hillside over there.

Ranger Molly: Talk about change, constant change, right? We're seeing over there the evidence that we really are in an active volcano and that's large scale evidence that they've actually measured change on with evidence of the volcano actually being active still. So we are still looking at something that could happen again.

Ranger MacNeil: Definitely. So, we mentioned before that we are in an active volcano when we were driving down here. You are now inside that active volcano. So, it's still rising and falling. . .
